Areas that cover partistate subtipellisted in Roman font under the state in which the largest part of its population lives and also in italic font at the bottom of the listings for other states covered by the MSA or division. There are 11 MSAs with more than 2,500,000 people. Employment in these MSAs is presented in two or more divisions rather than for the MSA as a whole. See UCensus Bureafor definitions of MSAs and divisions.

²Industry: The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) reports employment for construction, mining and logging combined for six states;ttbs:@bisumbia and MSAs in which mining and logging have only a small number of employers.
